It is with much excitement that this summer newsletter has been published! We continue to grow, and amazing things are happening at High Country Caregivers. This growth is only possible because of your continued support. The golf tournament was a huge success! Kudos to the coaches, their wives, athletes, celebrities, and sponsors that made this event so successful. This would not have been possible without our Board Members and dedicated staff. You all are such an inspiration to our families and community.

We are currently serving 313 children and 254 caregivers, and we are happy to announce we received a \$70,000 grant from the Dogwood Health Trust to add a social worker in Mitchell, Avery, and Yancey Counties. This grant will provide much-needed services to our clients. We are also working on a model for our program to be considered for replication throughout North Carolina and possibly further. Helping us to accomplish this goal, the Duke Endowment and the Grandfamilies & Kinship Support Network will be visiting High Country Caregivers. Potential funding and recognition from these two foundations is an honor.

EVENT IN REVIEW

The Coaches' Golf Tournament & Upcoming Events

These proceeds will support High Country Caregivers programs and services dedicated to families navigating kinship care. With over 250 people in attendance, the dinner and silent auction were held at the Grandview Ballroom at Appalachian State University. Returning by popular demand for the live music is the award-winning 8-piece Motown band, "The Business." Event check-in begins at 5:00pm on September 14th.




